Brackley Town Saints 0 v 0 Hadley FA Cup | Preliminary Round Monday 27 August 2018, 3.00pm, St James Park, Brackley

No saints or sinners in goalless draw

Hadley and Brackley Town Saints battled to a goalless draw in the FA Cup Preliminary Round at St James Park, as the Bricks failed to score for the first time this season. The draw sets up an intriguing replay on Wednesday night with the winners due to travel to Spartan South Midland Premier League side Leverstock Green in the FA Cup First Qualifying Round in two weeks time.

The Saints edged the first half and may have felt hard done by to be level at the break. The two sides could not have been more stylistically different, with Hadley preferring a high press and a more direct style, and Brackley Town Saints seeking to build out from the back and retain possession.

The best chance of the half came on 31 minutes after Bricks defender Sam Lyon conceded a free kick on the edge of the box. Hadley goalkeeper Ben Goode could only stand and watch as the Saint's free kick, taken by Lewis Baldwin, was lashed against the bar and fell to safety. It was the second let off in the half for Hadley, after Goode had earlier tipped a fine Saints effort around the post with a finger tip save.

Bricks left back Alfie Bartram looked dangerous on the left hand side and consistently had the better of the Saints right back. However, he was unable to find the killer ball for either Ashley Taylor-Forbes or Jeff Idemudia to latch onto.

After the interval, Hadley were much improved and continued to deploy a high press that forced the Saints side into defensive mistakes. Half time substitute Yemi Buraimoh brought more solidity to the midfield which started to pay dividends towards the end of the second half. A few good chances came our way, starting with Jeff Idemudia going in one-on-one with the keeper but then having to cut back and pass the ball instead of getting a shot away. Aaron Scott also rose highest from a Hadley corner to head the ball against the bar. However, the linesman had adjudged the delivery to have gone out of play on its way into the box and the danger passed for the Saints. Our final chance came from another set piece, with centre back Sam Lyon finding space about 6 yards out from goal but his header was comfortably saved by the Brackley keeper, much to the disappointment of the Hadley Bricks who had been in fine voice throughout the second half.

Saints did look dangerous on the break throughout the second half as the game opened up, and could have secured safe passage through to the next round but for the lack of final ball. This was typified by a failure to capitalise on a late counterattack which saw them 3v2 against Brick defenders Stephen O'Hara and Sam Lyon. The final ball was collected by O'Hara much to the relief of the Hadley management team and supporters.

Both sides left the pitch feeling they could have won the game, but both will now face off in a replay at Potters Bar Town on Wednesday night. The country waits to see which side will be Saints and which will be Sinners come the end of the tie.

chances of a play-off place. Midfielder Jon Brady was given the caretaker's job while the job was advertised. Eventually, Brady was appointed as permanent manager for the 2009–10 season. The club finished in 5th place, their highest ever finish in the non league pyramid, but lost in the play-off semi-final to Nuneaton Town. The 2011–12 season saw Brackley reach the Football Conference after winning the Southern League Premier Division title by 8 points. Brackley went top of the table after 20 games and never relinquished their top position for the remainder of the season. On top of the league title the club retained the Northamptonshire Hillier Senior Cup, beating Conference North club Corby Town in the final at Nene Park. They completed a treble by also claiming the Maunsell Cup for the first time in their history after they defeated Northampton Town 1–0 in a game played during pre-season.

The club retained the Maunsell Cup in July 2012, beating a youthful Peterborough United side 3–0 at St James Park. The club has also added the Southern League Champions Cup to their trophy cabinet in 2012–13 season, beating Clevedon Town 2–1.

About Brackley Town Saints FC

Brackley Town Saints is the Reserve Team of Brackley Town FC who play in the National League North.

Nickname(s) - The Saints

Founded - 2015 (they joined Division One East of the Hellenic League in 2014 under the name Brackley Town Development. After finishing as runners-up in their first season, they were promoted to the Premier Division and adopted their current name). Brackley Town FC was founded in 1890.

FACING US TODAY—Brackley Town Saints

Brackley Town FC was formed in 1890 and were initially a prominent side in the area, but fell away, with most of the period before World War II being spent in the Oxfordshire Senior Football League, before a switch to the North Bucks and District League in the post war years. In 1968 they took a step down the ladder by joining the Banbury & District League. In



1974 they moved back to the North Bucks League and also moved to their current St James Park ground in Churchill Way. A small clubhouse and changing rooms were built and by 1977 the club had stepped up to the Hellenic League.

They stayed in Division One until 1983 when they switched to the United Counties League, where they won the Division One title at the first attempt. Although they were Premier Division runners-up in 1988–89 their time in the division was generally spent near the foot of the table, with three consecutive last-place finishes between 1992 and 1994. In 1994 the club moved back to the Hellenic League. After a mediocre first season, Phil Lines took over as manager and led them to the Premier Division title in 1997 and with it promotion to the Southern League. However, they only managed two seasons at that level during which, with finances at full stretch, the club was forced into liquidation in February 1999 with debts of over £100,000. The club was saved from extinction but demoted back into the Hellenic League.

Despite a speedy turnover of managers they consistently finished in the Hellenic League's top 10 and were promoted back to the Southern League after winning the title in 2004. Phil Lines returned in February 2006 and guided the club to a third place finish, culminating in defeat in the last few minutes of the play-off final for promotion to the Southern League Premier Division. In 2006-07, Brackley finished top of the Southern League Division One Midlands. In the 2007–08 season, they competed in the Southern League Premier Division. Manager Phil Lines, however, became director of football, and Roger Ashby became the new manager for the new season. Ashby was soon sacked by the club replaced by former player David Oldfield in a player/manager role. Oldfield departed Brackley Town at the end of the season to join Peterborough United, after which Phil Lines came back as manager. During the 2006–07 season, Brackley reached the fourth qualifying round of the FA Cup (the round immediately prior to the first round proper), up until then their best achievement in that competition, but were knocked out at that stage by Havant & Waterlooville. Two seasons later Brackley surpassed this by beating Hampton & Richmond Borough in the fourth qualifying round to reach the first round proper for the first time.

They went on to lose 2–1 to Eastwood Town at Coronation Park. Phil Lines handed in his resignation in April 2009 after a run of bad results ended Town's


