## Match Day Safety Briefing for all Players and Officials

- Be aware of your own personal health. If you show any of the Covid-19 symptoms you must stay at home, inform NHS Test and Trace and seek medical advice. DO NOT ATTEND THE GROUND IF YOU ARE SHOWING ANY SYMPTOMS OF COVID 19
- Where possible maintain social distancing This won't always be possible in a competitive match environment (for example when tackling an opponent) and that is acceptable. However, before, and after a game you should maintain social distancing
- Support NHS Test and Trace. You will be asked to provide your details via the EVEPASS APP so that in the event of a Covid-19 outbreak those potentially infected can be traced. This is to everyone's benefit so please co-operate
- Be responsible Read the guidance provided by The FA and by your club so that you are aware of the changes to the game and what is expected of you. This will include things like being prepared to wash your own kit, bringing your own labelled water bottle and being aware of changes to meet-up times
- <u>Practise good hygiene</u>- Wash your hands regularly and before, during and after a game.
- After the gameChanging rooms and showers are likely to
  be closed and any socialising must follow the Government's
  Guidance on social distancing.

 Committee and staff small car park on entry to ground Players and guests main car park outside clubhouse

#### Stand:

Do not use seats with a cross on them

#### **Dressing Rooms**

- Divide teams into two groups for each team to change and shower
- Only Physio's/ Medical staff allowed in the dressing rooms
- No team talks in dressing rooms.
